What: 11th Annual Honeysuckle Removal Project

When: Saturday, November 7th, 2009

Time: 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Honeysuckle is a non-native, invasive plant species that negatively impacts native Missouri flora. Every fall a group of volunteers with the Kennedy Woods Advisory Group and Forest Park Forever spends a day cutting the vegetation and painting the stems with a Roundup™ solution to kill the roots.

This year's project will take place in the wooded area across from Jefferson Lake in the Eastern section of Forest Park. See map below for arrival and parking instructions. Volunteers should bring work gloves and pair of loppers (if you have access to tools). Forest Park Forever will provide beverages, snacks and a small assortment of work gloves and tools.

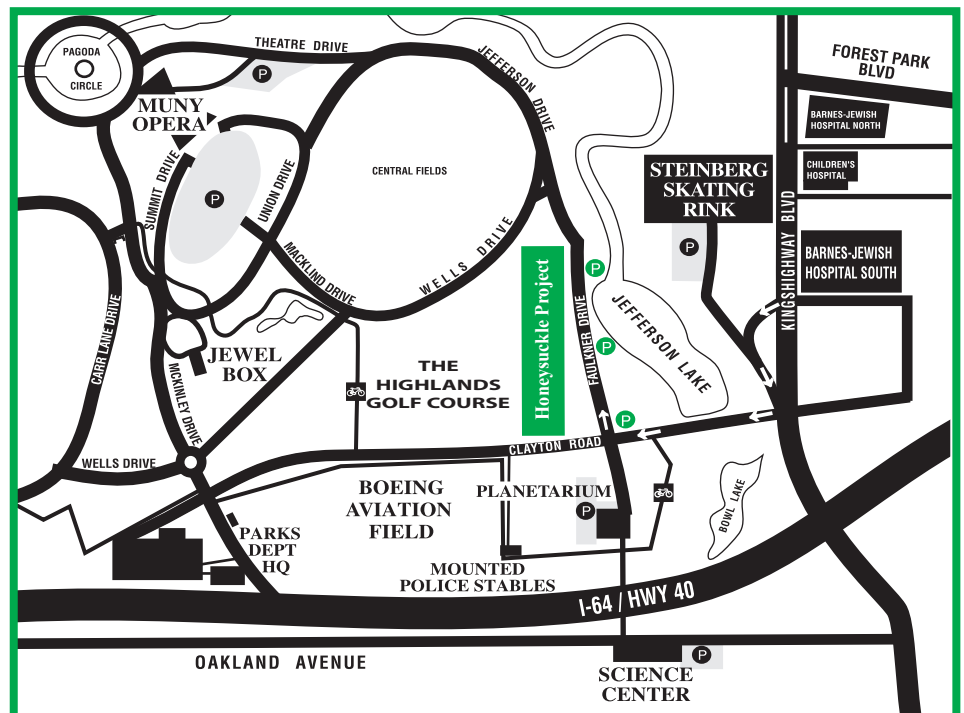
