TRANSPORTATION & SAFETY TIPS

For construction/ access updates, visit forestparkmap.org/alerts.

A few safety tips to keep in mind:

- Prior to your arrival by car, store valuables and personal belongings out of sight, like in your trunk.
- Park in the convenient Visitor Center lots. Members of the St. Louis Police Department, Mounted Police and Park Rangers protect and serve Forest Park. During early and mid-mornings, there is a special monitoring focus on these lots.
- Consider storing valuables in lockers in the Dennis & Judith Jones Visitor and Education Center.
- If you are in an emergency situation, look for the nearest street light pole. The recently installed light pole address marker system means that a 911 operator will be able to locate you even if you are not sure of your location.

YEAR-ROUND METRO TRANSIT

- The Hampton 90 bus route serves the Missouri History Museum, the Grand Basin, Saint Louis Art Museum, Zoo and connects to the DeBalviere/Forest Park Station.
- The Forest Park MetroLink station is located at DeBalviere and Forest Park Parkway, just one block north of the Missouri History Museum.
- The Central West End MetroLink station is located on Euclid Ave., just east of Barnes-Jewish Hospital, between Hospital Way & Children's Place.
- The Skinker MetroLink station is located at Skinker Blvd. and Forest Park Parkway, on the western edge of the Park near Washington University.
